Dear Appellate Counsel:

IMPORTANT MEDIATION INFORMATION - PLEASE READ

Since 2002, the Court of Appeals has provided represented parties the opportunity to mediate some cases pending on appeal. The program has consistently resulted in settlements in at least 50% of the cases in the program, but you can participate only if you return the attached form and if all parties agree on the type of mediator you desire. Most civil cases in which all parties are represented by counsel are eligible to participate in the mediation program; only termination of parental rights cases, juvenile cases, and cases addressing registration or monitoring of sex offenders are excluded. All counsel of record must return the Consent to Mediation form to the Court of Appeals within 15 days after docketing of the appeal before you will be assigned to the program.

You have three choices of type of mediator: (1) you may choose a current Court of Appeals judge mediator, at no fee. You may not choose, nor may you have any input into which judge is selected as your mediator, as the assignments are strictly on a rotating basis. The judge mediator will have no further involvement in the case, if it does not settle. (2) You may choose to select an Emergency Recall Court of Appeals judge as your mediator, at the per diem amount provided by law which is presently \$400.00, and you may choose the retired judge mediator you want. If you would like to consider using an Emergency Recall Judge, please contact the mediation coordinator for the Court of Appeals to find out which judges are available. Your third option is to hire a private mediator if all parties agree and the parties must pay the private mediator's fee as agreed among the parties. However, all parties must agree on one type of mediator.

If you choose to participate, the Consent to Mediation Form which is signed by all parties will also serve as a Motion for Extension of Time and the appellant will receive a 60 day extension of time to file the appellant's brief. If the mediation is not completed within the time allowed by the 60 day extension of time, the parties are responsible for filing with the Court of Appeals a separate motion showing good cause for an extension of time to extend any deadline that would otherwise run while mediation proceeds.
